Constitutional Amendments

18 th Amendment (1919) "The Noble Experiment"	<u>Prohibition</u> – banning alcohol from sale or purchase Lasted from 1920–1933
19 th Amendment (1920)	The changing role of women – women get the right to vote

Flappers	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Women have separate spheres (areas)– women's vote– job market– short hair, short skirts– rebelling from "acceptable" behavior
Speakeasies	<ul style="list-style-type: none">– underground bars• Bootleggers → black market for alcohol• Rise in organized crime → Al Capone
