↳ abolitionist and orator (speaker)

↳ for emancipation

↳ against slavery

Robert E. Lee

↳ Commander of the Confederate Army

Harper's Ferry

↳ led by John Brown and his sons

↳ tried to get the slaves to rise up
against their white owners

↳ ~~take~~ take the weapons from the Federal Arsenal

↳ slaves refused to join in

↳ John Brown and his men were
overtaken by the townspeople

↳ Marines, led by Robert E. Lee, came
to defend the arsenal

↳ John Brown was injured, his sons
all died

↳ charged with treason and sentenced
to death → executed

Emancipation Proclamation	Proposed by Lincoln ↳ free the slaves ↳ required by Constitution ↳ military necessity
Thirteenth Amendment	abolishes slavery
Fifteenth Amendment	citizenship rights to African Americans
